

MINUTES FOR THE 15th DAY OF OCTOBER 2019

Be it remembered that on Tuesday, October 15th, 2019 the Groesbeck City Council met in Regular Session at 6:00 p.m. at the Groesbeck Council Chambers with the Honorable Mayor Ray O'Docharty presiding and with Matthew Dawley, Kim Harris, Tamikia Jackson, Warren Anglin and Mike Thompson being present and with no one being absent. Staff members present were Chris Henson, Brenda Jackson, Jamie McLean and Keith Tilley.

A list of visitors is attached to the agenda on file.

Brother Richard Williams of Church of Christ gave the invocation and the Junior Marines Group led the pledge to the flags.

Mayor Ray O'Docharty called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Proper posting of the notice of the meeting was verified and a quorum of members was present.

6. Citizen's Comments

Alta Stone commented on the condition of North Archer Street which runs in front of her residence. Mrs. Stone asked why the other end of the street had asphalt on it and her end had only sand mix. After living there for fifty-six years and paying taxes, she feels offended. She asked that something else be done to this street.

7. Consent Agenda

- a. Approval of Minutes: Regular Session September 17, 2019
- b. Approval of One Year Recycling Center Contract Renewal between Limestone County and City of Groesbeck for October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020
- c. Approval of One Year Service Agreement between Limestone County and Groesbeck Memorial Library for October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020

A motion was made by Matthew Dawley and seconded by Mike Thompson to approve the consent agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

8. Consider Approval of 2019 Tax Roll

A motion was made by Matthew Dawley and seconded by Warren Anglin to approve the 2019 Tax Roll. Motion carried unanimously.

9. Consider Approval to Transfer Vehicles from City to Fire Department

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10. City Administrator Chris Henson requested that all but one fire truck be reverted to the fire department allowing the fire department to be completely responsible for insurance and anything else concerning the vehicles. The 2017 Spartan is still being paid on under the city's name and will be done at a later date. A motion was made by Mike Thompson and seconded by Tamikia Jackson to approve transferring all fire trucks with the exception of the 2017 Spartan to the Groesbeck Volunteer Department. Motion carried unanimously.

Keith Tilley, Public Works Director stated that there were three streets being worked on at this time and planning to continue on the list.

Mayor O'Docharty announced that trick or treat is officially set for October 31 and the Chamber and Groesbeck Journal will be having activities on October 26 from 4:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. at the city park.

Motion to adjourn was made by Warren Anglin and seconded by Matthew Dawley. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:17 p.m.
